Refugee and Humanitarian (Migrant) (Class BA) visa****Who should use this application form?**

You should use this form if you are outside Australia and wish to apply for a Refugee and Humanitarian (Migrant) (Class BA) visa for permanent resettlement in Australia. This class of visa includes the following subclasses:

- ♦ Refugee (Subclass 200)
- ♦ In-country Special Humanitarian (Subclass 201)
- ♦ Global Special Humanitarian (Subclass 202)
- ♦ Emergency Rescue (Subclass 203)
- ♦ Woman at Risk (Subclass 204).

Your application will be assessed against all these subclasses. Information about who may be granted visas under these subclasses is set out on the next page.

Immediate Family of humanitarian entrants and protection visa holders

You should also use this form if a member of your 'immediate family' was granted a Protection Visa (Subclass 866) in Australia, or a Refugee and Humanitarian (Migrant) (Class BA) visa outside Australia within the last 5 years. Note that **'immediate family'** means you are the **spouse (husband or wife, married or de facto), dependent child or parent** of the person in Australia proposing your entry. You can only apply as a parent under these provisions if the child in Australia is under 18 years of age. The relationship between you and your proposer in Australia must have been declared to the Department of Immigration and Multicultural Affairs (DIMA) **before** your proposer was granted their visa, and the relationship must be ongoing (Question 8).

Who should be included in your application?

You should include in this form ALL members of your family unit. Your family unit includes your spouse, dependent children outside Australia and other dependent relatives who usually live with you (e.g. a dependent parent). Details of dependent family members who are NOT intending to migrate should be included at Question 28. "Dependent" means wholly or substantially dependent on you or your spouse for financial, psychological or physical support. Non-dependent family members (e.g. married children or children over 18 who have their own income) should complete their own form 842.

If you do not declare members of your immediate family not applying with you, (e.g. at Question 29) they may not be eligible to access the Immediate Family provisions, referred to above, at a later date.

Change of circumstances

If your circumstances change in any way after you have lodged this form (e.g. if you marry or get engaged to be married), you must inform the office where you lodged this application. If a child is born to you after this application is lodged, it will be included in your application provided you notify us **before the visa decision**.

Is there an application charge or processing charge?

No—there is no charge for this form or for lodging an application.

Preparing your application

You should complete the questions in this form truthfully and fully and attach any supporting documents. Forms that are incomplete could delay a decision being made on your application, or could lead to refusal of your application.

If you need more space for any of your answers, attach a separate page which has been signed and dated by each person aged 18 years or over included in this application.

Help with this form

If you wish to seek help to fill out this form, you may do so, but you will need to tell us who provided this assistance (see Question 34).

You may use a migration agent registered in Australia if you wish. A list of registered migration agents is available from offices of the Department of Immigration and Multicultural Affairs or the Migration Institute of Australia (PO Box K366, Haymarket NSW 1240).

Registered agents have demonstrated that they are competent and of good character, and are bound by the Code of Conduct for Migration Agents.

Where can you lodge this form?

This form can only be lodged **OUTSIDE** Australia. You should lodge it at your nearest Australian mission (Embassy, High Commission, Consulate or Consulate-General).

Interviews and requests for more information

We will advise you if you are required to attend an interview or if you need to provide more documents or information.

You should be aware that there is strong interest in humanitarian migration to Australia and processing times may be lengthy.

What documents should you attach to this form?

- ♦ Four (4) passport photographs of each person included in the application, with the name of the person written on the back.
- ♦ Evidence of the identity of each person included in the application (e.g. certified* copies of birth certificates, marriage certificates, passports, national identity card). (Question 2)
- ♦ If you are registered with any international organisation dealing with refugees (e.g. United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees - UNHCR), attach evidence of this registration. (Question 6)
- ♦ If your entry to Australia is being proposed by a person or organisation in Australia, attach form 681 *Refugee and special humanitarian proposal*, (available in Australia at DIMA offices). (Question 7)
- ♦ If you are applying under the 'Immediate Family' provisions, please also attach a certified* copy of the visa of your proposer in Australia and evidence of your relationship to your proposer (e.g. certified* copy of marriage/birth certificate). (Question 8)
- ♦ Certified* copies of the travel documents and/or identity cards held by any person included in the application (if available). (Question 11)
- ♦ Certified* copies of any visas/residence permits held by any person included in the application. (Question 13)
- ♦ Certified* copies of any discharge papers (if available). (Question 21)
- ♦ Certified* copies of any current marriage/divorce papers or death certificate (if applicable). (Question 24)
- ♦ Certified* copies of any previous marriage papers and divorce papers (if applicable). (Question 25)
- ♦ Certified* copies of child custody papers (if applicable). (Question 26)
- ♦ Certified* copies of adoption papers (if applicable). (Question 27)
- * Copies of documents must be certified as true copies of the original by a Justice of the Peace, Commissioner for Declarations, a person before whom a Statutory Declaration may be made under the *Statutory Declarations Act 1959*, or, outside Australia, by a person who is the equivalent of a Justice of the Peace or Commissioner for Declarations.

Who can migrate to Australia under the Refugee and Humanitarian programs?

Only a limited number of places is available. Each year, before deciding the number of places, the Australian Government considers:

- ♦ the views of the United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees (UNHCR);
- ♦ the views of the Australian community; and
- ♦ Australia's ability to settle refugees and people in humanitarian need.

The requirements for migrating to Australia are set out in Australia's Migration Act and Regulations. If you are seeking entry to Australia under the Refugee and Humanitarian Programs your application will be assessed against the Refugee and Humanitarian (Migrant) (Class BA) visa class, which has five subclasses.

You must be assessed as meeting all the requirements in at least one of these subclasses before you can be granted a visa to migrate to Australia. The main requirements for each subclass are:

Refugee

To migrate to Australia under this subclass you must be:

- ♦ living outside your home country;
- ♦ subject to persecution in your home country; and
- ♦ in need of resettlement.

The UNHCR provides advice to the Australian Government on the need for resettlement.

Woman at Risk

To migrate to Australia under this subclass you must be:

- ♦ a woman living outside your own country;
- ♦ subject to persecution in your own country or be registered as being 'of concern' to UNHCR;
- ♦ without the protection of a male relative; and
- ♦ in danger of victimisation, harassment or serious abuse because you are female.

Global Special Humanitarian Program

To migrate to Australia under this subclass you must:

- ♦ be subject to substantial discrimination amounting to a gross violation of your human rights in your home country;
- ♦ be living outside your home country;
- ♦ include a valid form 681 *Refugee and Special Humanitarian Proposal* with your application.

Form 681 is available from offices of the Department of Immigration and Multicultural Affairs (DIMA) in Australia. The form may be completed by an Australian citizen or permanent resident or community organisation in Australia willing to support your application (a 'proposer'). There is no charge for form 681.

Emergency Rescue

Generally you would need the UNHCR to request urgent assistance on your behalf under this subclass.

To migrate to Australia under this subclass you must be:

- ♦ subject to persecution in your home country; and
- ♦ in urgent need of resettlement because your life or freedom is in immediate danger.

In-country Special Humanitarian Program

Only a small number of places are available under this subclass and at present these are principally for people in Central America.

To migrate under this subclass you must be:

- ♦ subject to persecution; and
- ♦ in your home country.

Children under 18

Children under the age of 18 who have no parents, or who have been separated from their parents, may also be able to migrate to Australia under the visa subclasses listed above. However, in assessing a child's refugee or humanitarian claims, the Australian government must be satisfied that resettlement in Australia is in the best interests of the child, and that the rights of parents, if any, are properly considered.

Processing information

You may need to have a medical and an X-ray examination as part of the assessment of your application. You may also be asked to undergo medical treatment. The Australian Government reserves the right to conduct character checks on all adult applicants. Details of your application are not passed to your home country.

If you are granted a visa under the Refugee, Woman at Risk, Emergency Rescue or In-Country Special Humanitarian Programs, the Australian Government will pay the costs of health and character processing. The Australian Government will also meet travel costs, including airfares, of people approved under these programs if they do not have access to more than \$AUD 10,000 for an individual or \$AUD 20,000 for a family.

The Australian Government does not pay the costs for medical or X-ray examinations, medical treatment or character checks for applicants under the Global Special Humanitarian Program. The applicant or the applicant's proposer in Australia must pay these costs. Successful applicants under the Global Special Humanitarian Program or their proposers must pay for the applicant's travel, including airfares, to Australia.

Review rights

If your application is refused, it is not possible to obtain a review of the decision by the Migration Review Tribunal or the Refugee Review Tribunal.

Settlement Services

If your application to migrate to Australia is successful, information on the personal possessions that you may take with you to Australia is available from the office that granted your visa.

The Australian Government provides a range of services, including English language training, to help Refugee/Humanitarian program entrants settle in Australia. Information about these services is available through offices of the Department of Immigration and Multicultural Affairs in Australia or the office that granted your visa.

About the information you give on this form

The Department of Immigration and Multicultural Affairs (DIMA) is authorised to collect information provided on this form under Part 2 of the *Migration Act 1958*: 'Control of Arrival and Presence of Non-citizens'. The information provided will be used for assessing your eligibility for a Refugee and Humanitarian (Migrant) visa and for other purposes relating to the administration of the Migration Act.

Information provided might also be disclosed to other agencies authorised to receive information in relation to foreign affairs, adoption, border control, business skills, citizenship, education, health, law enforcement, taxation, pensions and benefits, or service provision to refugees and humanitarian entrants. The information form 993i *Safeguarding your personal information*, available from DIMA offices in Australia, or from where you collected this form, gives details about the agencies to which your information might be disclosed.

DIMA may also provide some information in your application to the office of the United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees (UNHCR). We will endeavour to ensure that the details of your application are not passed to your home country.

If you provide false or misleading information, your visa application may be refused or your visa may be cancelled.
